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# SUPERVISING OFFICER'S STATEMENT

This Annual Report for financial year 2021/2022 has been prepared according to the guidelines of the Ministry of Finance Economic Planning and Development.

The financial budget for year 2021/2022 was around 950 Million Rupees. Much of the fund has been used for the procurement of firefighting appliances. The following main items have been procured:

- Fifteen (15) of firefighting and rescue vehicles
- One (1) hazmat vehicle
- One (1) Articulated Hydraulic Platform 55-65 meter
- Thirteen(13) Trailer Mounted Pumps
- Two (2) Water Carrier
- Nine (9) Towing vehicles for Trailer Mounted Pumps

Firefighting and rescue vehicles are of utmost importance to the MFRS. Without vehicles the mission of the service cannot be achieved. Firefighting crew cannot be conveyed from station to fire ground. Firefighting crew should also be provided with firefighting equipment and communication equipment respectively.

During the financial year 2021/2022, this organization responded to six structural fires where there have been considerable damage to the structures. The six (6) fires are as hereunder:

- Vessels Fire at Bain Des Dames
- Denim de Iles Factory Fire at Ile D'armbre
- Building Fire J. Kalachand at Bel Air
- Craft Farket Fire at Caudan
- Emanuel Anquetil building fire
- Atlantic Commercial Shop fire at Port Louis

Moreover, these have been two cyclones threat to the Island which are as follows:

- (1) Batsirai
- (2) Emnati

The Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service responded to more than 300 request during these two cyclones. Moreover, there were torrential rains in the month of January 2022 to April 2022. Firefighting crew has intervened day and night for pumping of accumulated water in buildings.

I seized this opportunity to thank the uniform staff as well as civilian staff to accomplish all works during the financial year 2021 and 2022. It can be concluded that with support of one and all the MFRS has been successful in its mission.

### Role and function of the Ministry of Local Government

The Ministry together with the Chief Fire Officer collaborate to devise policy relating to development of the Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service. They have to ensure that projects are efficiently and effectively implemented with a view to achieve objectives set.

#### The key objectives are:-

- i. To coordinate the construction of new infrastructure required for Fire Station;
- ii. To promote the training and development program for uniformed staff of Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service;
- iii. To provide support to procure new appliances and equipment for the service; and
- iv. To provide support to Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service in developing Fire Safety legislations for the Republic of Mauritius.

### **Different section and operations in Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service**

**Operation Section:** Eleven Fire Stations are located throughout the Island.

**Special Operation Division:** Located in the compound of Coromandel Fire Station and have specialized team on rope rescue, water pumping, and high angle rescue operations.

**Training Division:** Help to train newly recruited firefighters, have training for drivers, sensitize people on fire safety, and help people to have a good physical fitness and swimming skills.

**Fire Safety Division:** Located at Atalian Tower, 57 Labourdonnais Street, Port Louis. The main duty is to receive application for issue of fire certificate, issuing of fire certificate, carry out inspection, impose fire safety measures, and deliver lectures to different institution around the island. Approved construction plan.


**Hydrant Section**: Located at Curepipe Fire Station. It carries out survey on sub division of land and recommend installations of fire hydrants.

**Radio Workshop:** The Radio Workshop is located in the compound of Coromandel Fire Station. This Unit ensure proper radio communication in the service. A proper and efficient radio communication help to achieve the mission of MFRS. The Workshop is also responsible for repair of radios, TV and all electrical apparatus and equipment available in the Department.

**Mechanical Workshop:** Help to get vehicles repaired either outdoor or indoor.

### **GENDER STATEMENT**

- In 2011, the Scheme of Service for the post of Firefighter was amended to enable female candidates to apply for the post firefighters. Consequently, as from 2012, recruitment of Firefighters is carried out among candidates irrespective of gender, that is, female and male candidates are considered on the same footing. In financial year 2021/2022 there were 21 female Firefighters in the firefighter cadre.
- At Fire Station level, amenities such as separate barracks, toilets, bathroom and changing rooms have been provided for female Firefighters. Pregnant Firefighters are being given facilities to work in administration section to perform office duties. When posted to Fire Stations, pregnant Firefighters are placed on day duty to perform administrative work.

### **STAFF WELFARE**

The Barracks and Recreation Fund caters for the staff welfare at Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service. All uniformed staff are eligible to contribute to the Barracks and Recreation Fund. Due to the prevailing Pandemic COVID-19, no activity has been organized. The Sanitary Protocol had been strictly followed in order to prevent the propagation of COVID-19. No football, volleyball or other welfare activities have been organized. For all officers proceeding on retirement, a shield is remitted to them and a note of thanks by the Chief Fire Officer for the service rendered by the officer.

### **HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELLNESS OF STAFF**

The Ministry of Civil Service Affairs has designated a Health and Safety Officer to MFRS. Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service has one Health and Safety Officer. He coordinates all activities regarding Safety of officers in the Service. Regular meetings are organized and progress are being monitored. Welfare of officers is ensured by providing microwaves, refrigerators, water purifiers, repairs of windows/window panes provisions of curtains etc. Attention is also given to the safety such as provision of personal protective equipment to Fire Officers especially those working on fire ground or emergency site.

A medical surveillance exercise is carried out at least twice yearly for all officers of all grades. The PRB Report 2021 has also proposed that officers below sixty (60) years to undergo medical examination test once every two years but for officers above 60 years, they should undergo medical examination test at least once yearly.



### **Analysis**

Broadly, an increase in the MFRS actual Estimates is observed with respect to the financial year 2021/22 compared to 2020/21.

**Compensation of Employees** was subject to an increase in the wake of the implementation of the PRB 2021 Report.

MFRS aim for the preparedness to combat various physical hazards to which people and property are exposed impacted the 2021/22 Estimates with regards to **Acquisition of Non-Financial Assets**.

Under **Acquisition of Non-Financial Assets** increased disbursements financed amongst other capital expenditure items the procurement of:-

- i. fifteen new firefighting vehicles which in all cost MUR 104 million,
- ii. an Hazmat vehicle for amount of MUR 22 million,
- iii. an Aerial Ladder Platform,
- iv. nine towing vehicles; and
- v. thirteen trailer mounted flood pumps.




### **STAFF WELFARE**

Time management is in view to achieve the following in Financial Year 2022/2023. The main aim of MFRS is to provide better service to the Public in Mauritius, responding emergency quicker and in an efficient manner.

Time management is striving hard to start the construction of two Fire Stations and to relocate Quatre-Bornes Fire Station. The two Fire Stations are proposed at Goodlands and Montagne Blanche. The construction and operation of these two Fire Stations will reduce the response time for emergencies hence ....... loss of life and reduce damage to property by fire. Quatre Bornes Fire Station is at present located in such a place that do not facilitate ingress and egress of Fire-appliances. Thus station will be located in a strategic place that will facilitate the dispatch of vehicles quickly. We are aiming to construct a modern fire station that would facilitate MFRS to achieve all challenges.

Recently, MFRS have acquired 13 Flood pumps and twenty firefighting vehicles. We expect that all supply of equipment be completed, minor defects be remedied and full payment be effected.

Our radio communication lack many radios due to the fact that there exist only one supplier and finds are limited. Nevertheless, the administration is working hard so that at least 30 % of equipment be charged in this Financial Year and that in the following years; after July 2022, the organisation will have 75 % of the radio communication.


